A BILL

To prevent plant enterprise terrorism.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Agroterrorism Preven-

5 tion Act of 2001".

6 SEC. 2. PLANT ENTERPRISE TERRORISM.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 43 of title 18, United

18	SEC. 5. NATIONAL AGROTERRORISM INCIDENT CLEARING-
19	HOUSE.
20	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Director shall establish and
21	maintain a national clearinghouse for information on inci-
22	dents of crime and terrorism—
23	(1) committed against or directed at any animal

24 or plant enterprise;

(2) committed against or directed at any com mercial activity because of the perceived impact or
 effect of such commercial activity on the environ ment; or

5 (3) committed against or directed at any person
6 because of such person's perceived connection with
7 or support of any enterprise or activity described in
8 paragraph (1) or (2).

9 (b) CLEARINGHOUSE.—The clearinghouse established
10 under subsection (a) shall—

(1) accept, collect, and maintain information on
incidents described in subsection (a) that is submitted to the clearinghouse by Federal, State, and
local law enforcement agencies, by law enforcement
agencies of foreign countries, and by victims of such
incidents;

17 (2) collate and index such information for pur-18 poses of cross-referencing; and

19 (3) upon request from a Federal, State, or local
20 law enforcement agency, or from a law enforcement
21 agency of a foreign country, provide such informa22 tion to assist in the investigation of an incident de23 scribed in subsection (a).

(c) SCOPE OF 1 INFORMATION.—The information 2 maintained by the clearinghouse for each incident shall, 3 to the extent practicable, include— 4 (1) the date, time, and place of the incident; 5 (2) details of the incident; 6 (3) any available information on suspects or 7 perpetrators of the incident; and 8 (4) any other relevant information. 9 (d) DESIGN OF CLEARINGHOUSE.—The clearing-10 house shall be designed for maximum ease of use by participating law enforcement agencies. 11 12 (e) PUBLICITY.—The Director shall publicize the existence of the clearinghouse to law enforcement agencies 13 14 by appropriate means. 15 (f) RESOURCES.—In establishing and maintaining the clearinghouse, the Director may— 16 17 (1) through the Attorney General, utilize the re-18 sources of any other department or agency of the 19 Federal Government; and 20 (2) accept assistance and information from pri-21 vate organizations or individuals. 22 (g) COORDINATION.—The Director shall carry out 23 the Director's responsibilities under this section in co-24 operation with the Director of the Bureau of Alcohol, To-25 bacco, and Firearms.

1 (h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

2 (1) the term "animal or plant enterprise" has
3 the same meaning as in section 43 of title 18,
4 United States Code; and

5 (2) the term "Director" means the Director of6 the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

7 (i) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
8 are authorized to be appropriated for each of fiscal years
9 2002 through 2007 such sums as are necessary to carry
10 out this section.

11 SEC. 6. ANIMAL AND PLANT RESEARCH SECURITY PRO-12 GRAMS.

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—

14 (1) GRANTS AUTHORIZED.—The Director15 shall—

16 (A) award grants on a competitive basis to
17 colleges and universities for technical assist18 ance, threat and risk assessments, and other
19 activities related to improving security at indi20 vidual research universities; and

(B) develop a comprehensive security report for universities, colleges and nonprofit organizations which examines the threat posed by
animal and plant enterprise terrorism on research activities, and includes strategies for re-

ducing this threat, including education, facility
 hardening, and coordination with law enforce ment.

4 (2) APPLICATION.—To be eligible to receive a
5 grant under this section a college or university shall
6 submit to the Director an application in such form
7 and containing such information as the Director
8 may require, including information relating to the
9 security needs of the institution.

10 (3) PRIORITY.—In awarding grants under this
11 section, the Director shall give priority to colleges
12 and universities that demonstrate the highest secu13 rity needs, as reported in the application submitted
14 under paragraph (2).

(b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
\$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2002, 2003.

(c) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "Director" means the Director of the National Science Foundation.

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
