## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Abortion Non-Dis-
3	erimination Act of 2002".
4	SEC. 2. ABORTION NON-DISCRIMINATION.
5	Section 245 of the Public Health Service Act (42
6	U.S.C. 238n) is amended—
7	(1) in the section heading, by striking "RE-
8	GARDING TRAINING AND LICENSING OF PHYSICIANS"
9	and inserting "REGARDING TRAINING, LICENSING,
10	AND PRACTICE OF PHYSICIANS AND OTHER HEALTH
11	CARE ENTITIES";
12	(2) in subsection (a)(1), by striking "to perform
13	such abortions" and inserting "to perform, provide
14	coverage of, or pay for induced abortions"; and
15	(3) in subsection $(c)(2)$ —
16	(A) by inserting "or other health profes-
17	sional," after "an individual physician";
18	(B) by striking "and a participant" and in-
19	serting "a participant"; and
20	(C) by inserting before the period the fol-
21	lowing: ", a hospital, a provider sponsored orga-
22	nization, a health maintenance organization, a
23	health insurance plan, or any other kind of
24	health care facility, organization or plan".
