A BILL

To make permanent the moratorium on taxes on Internet access and multiple and discriminatory taxes on electronic commerce imposed by the Internet Tax Freedom Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Internet Tax Non-dis-
5 crimination Act of 2003”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENT OF INTERNET TAX FREEDOM ACT.**

7 Section 1101(a) of the Internet Tax Freedom Act (47
8 U.S.C. 151 nt.) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “taxes during the period begin-
2 ning on October 1, 1998, and ending on November
3 1, 2003—” and inserting “taxes:”;

4 (2) by striking paragraph (1) and inserting the
5 following:

6 “(1) Taxes on Internet access.”; and

7 (3) by striking “multiple” in paragraph (2) and
8 inserting “Multiple”.

9 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF EXCEPTION.**

10 Section 1104 of the Internet Tax Freedom Act (47
11 U.S.C. 151 nt.) is amended by striking paragraph (10).
