1 SEC. 2. JURISDICTION LIMITATION.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 99 of title 28, United
3 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol4 lowing:

5 "§ 1632. Jurisdiction limitation

"No court established by Act of Congress shall have 6 7 jurisdiction to hear or determine any claim that the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag ('I pledge alle-8 9 giance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, 10 indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.') violates the 11 first article of amendment to the Constitution of the 12 United States.". 13

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of chapter 99 of title 28, United States
Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
item:

"1632. Jurisdiction limitation.".
