## A BILL

- To define the term "natural born Citizen" as used in the Constitution of the United States to establish eligibility for the Office of President.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Natural Born Citizen
  - 5 Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF "NATURAL BORN CITIZEN".
  - 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Congress finds and declares that
  - 8 the term "natural born Citizen" in Article II, Section 1,
  - 9 Clause 5 of the Constitution of the United States means—

1	(1) any person born in the United States and
2	subject to the jurisdiction thereof; and
3	(2) any person born outside the United
4	States—
5	(A) who derives citizenship at birth from a
6	United States citizen parent or parents pursu-
7	ant to an Act of Congress; or
8	(B) who is adopted by 18 years of age by
9	a United States citizen parent or parents who
10	are otherwise eligible to transmit citizenship to
11	a biological child pursuant to an Act of Con-
12	gress.
13	(b) United States.—In this section, the term
14	"United States", when used in a geographic sense, means
15	the several States of the United States and the District
16	of Columbia.
