- To establish a pilot program of Central Asian scholarships for undergraduate and graduate level public policy internships in the United States.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Central Asia Education
- 5 Enhancement Act of 2005".

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6 SEC. 2. CENTRAL ASIA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR PUB-

LIC POLICY INTERNSHIPS.

8 (a) PILOT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.—As part of the
9 educational and cultural exchange programs of the De10 partment of State, the Secretary of State shall establish

a pilot program for the fiscal years 2006, 2007, and 2008,
 of scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students
 from Central Asia for public policy internships in the
 United States. Subject to the availability of appropria tions, for each fiscal year 50 students shall participate in
 the program established under this section.

7 (b) GENERAL PROVISIONS.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as otherwise pro-9 vided in this section, the program established pursu-10 ant to subsection (a) shall be carried out under ap-11 plicable provisions of the United States Information 12 and Educational Exchange Act of 1948 and the Mu-13 tual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 14 1961.

15 (2) SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIRE16 MENTS.—In addition to such other requirements as
17 may be established by the Secretary of State, a
18 scholarship recipient under this section—

19 (A) shall be proficient in the English lan-20 guage;

(B) shall be a student at an undergraduate
or graduate school level at an accredited institution of higher education with a record of outstanding academic achievement and demonstrated intellectual abilities; and

1	(C) may not have received an academic
2	scholarship or grant from the United States
3	Government in the 3 years preceding the award
4	of a scholarship under this section.
5	(3) INTERNSHIPS.—Internships under this sec-
6	tion shall be for periods of not more than 6 months.
7	(4) PRIORITY CONSIDERATION.—In the award
8	of internships under this section, the Secretary shall
9	give priority consideration to students from
10	Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Uzbekistan.
11	(5) DEFINITION.—For the purposes of this sec-
12	tion, the term "Central Asia" means the countries
13	of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan,
14	Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan.
15	(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—In addi-
16	tion to such amounts as are otherwise authorized to be
17	appropriated for the Department of State for educational
18	and cultural exchange programs, there are authorized to
19	be appropriated for each of the fiscal years 2006, 2007,
20	and 2008, \$600,000 to carry out this section.

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
