- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Internet Anti-Corrup-
- 5 tion and Free Speech Protection Act of 2005".
- 6 SEC. 2. EXCLUSION OF INTERNET COMMUNICATIONS FROM
- 7 TREATMENT AS PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS.
- 8 Paragraph (22) of section 301 of the Federal Elec-
- 9 tion Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 431(22)) is amend-

- 1 ed by adding at the end the following: "Such term shall
- 2 not include any communication made over the Internet,
- 3 other than a communication placed on another person's
- 4 website for a fee, a communication made by any person
- 5 described in section 316 (other than a corporation de-
- 6 scribed in such section whose principal purpose is oper-
- 7 ating a web log), a communication made by a State, dis-
- 8 trict, or local committee of a political party described in
- 9 section 323(b), or a communication made by any political
- 10 committee.".
