## A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide for a budget-neutral two-year moratorium on certain Medicare physician payment reductions for imaging services.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.** This Act may be cited as the "Access to Medicare 4 5 Imaging Act of 2006". SEC. 2. BUDGET-NEUTRAL TWO-YEAR MORATORIUM ON 6 7 CERTAIN MEDICARE PHYSICIAN PAYMENT 8 **REDUCTIONS FOR IMAGING SERVICES.** 9 (a) MORATORIUM.—Subsections (b)(4)(A)and 10 (c)(2)(B)(v)(II) of section 1848 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395w-4), as added by section 5102 of the 11 12 Deficit Reduction Act of 2005, are each amended by striking "2007" and inserting "2009". 13 14 (b) BUDGET NEUTRALITY.— 15 (1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other 16 provision of law (including subclause (II) of section 17 1848(c)(2)(B)(ii) of the Social Security Act (42) 18 U.S.C. 1395w-4(c)(2)(B)(ii)), for 2007 and for 19 2008 the Secretary of Health and Human Services 20 shall reduce the payment amounts otherwise pro-21 vided under this part and part A (and not under 22 parts C and D) in a manner so as to provide for a 23 reduction in aggregate expenditures under this part 24 and part A for each such year of an amount equiva-

25 lent to the increase in expenditures under such sec-

tion for such year that the Secretary estimates will
 result from the application of the amendments made
 by subsection (a).

4 (2) NO EFFECT ON SUBSEQUENT PERIODS.—
5 The reduction in payment effected under paragraph
6 (1) for a year shall not apply to (or be taken into
7 account in) the computation of payment amounts for
8 a subsequent year.

9 (c) GAO STUDY ON PATIENT ACCESS TO IMAGING
10 SERVICES.—

11 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of 12 the United States shall conduct a comprehensive 13 study on patient access and service issues relating to 14 the availability and quality of imaging services in 15 physician offices and freestanding clinics that would 16 have resulted (but for subsection (a)) from payment 17 changes made by the amendments made by section 18 5102(b) of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005.

19 (2) DETAILS.—Such study also shall examine—
20 (A) reductions in review application to
21 multiple procedure reductions multiple proce22 dures and additional reductions associated with
23 changes in physician practice expense, with par24 ticular attention to rural and medically under25 served areas; and

(B) the appropriateness of using the hos-1 2 pital outpatient department prospective pay-3 ment system methodology to set reimbursement 4 under the medicare program for all imaging 5 services, regardless of site of service. (3) REPORT.—Not later than July 31, 2008, 6 7 the Comptroller General shall submit to Congress and the Secretary of Health and Human Services a 8 9 report on the study under this subsection and shall 10 include in the report such recommendations regard-11 ing extending the moratorium imposed under the amendments made by subsection (a) or such other 12 13 changes in medicare reimbursement for imaging 14 services as the Comptroller General deems appro-15 priate.

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
