3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Displaced Citizens5 Voter Protection Act of 2005".

1SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY OF PROTECTIONS FOR ABSENT2MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS TO3KATRINA EVACUEES.

4 (a) RIGHT OF KATRINA EVACUEES TO USE ABSEN5 TEE BALLOTING AND REGISTRATION PROCEDURES
6 AVAILABLE TO MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS.—In
7 the case of any individual who is an eligible Hurricane
8 Katrina evacuee—

9 (1) the individual shall be treated in the same
10 manner as an absent uniformed services voter and
11 overseas voter for purposes of the Uniformed and
12 Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (42 U.S.C.
13 1973ff et seq.), other than section 103(b)(1) (42
14 U.S.C. 1973ff-2(b)(1)); and

(2) the individual shall be deemed to be an individual who is entitled to vote by absentee ballot for
purposes of the National Voter Registration Act of
1993 and the Help America Vote Act of 2002.

19 (b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the
20 term "eligible Hurricane Katrina evacuee" means an indi21 vidual—

(1) who certifies to the appropriate State election official that the individual is absent from the
place of residence where the individual is otherwise
qualified to vote as a result of evacuation from an
area affected by Hurricane Katrina; and

(2) who provides the official with an affidavit
 stating that the individual intends to return to such
 place of residence after the election or elections in volved.

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5 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply with
6 respect to elections for Federal office held in calendar
7 years 2006 through 2008.

8 SEC. 3. REQUIRING DESIGNATED VOTER REGISTRATION 9 AGENCIES TO NOTIFY DISPLACED INDIVID10 UALS OF AVAILABILITY OF PROTECTIONS.

11 Each motor vehicle authority in a State and each 12 voter registration agency designated in a State under sec-13 tion 7(a) of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 14 (42 U.S.C. 1973gg-5(a)) shall take such steps as may be 15 necessary to notify individuals to whom services are provided of the protections provided by section 2 and of the 16 requirements for obtaining those protections, including the 17 requirement to submit an affidavit stating that the indi-18 vidual intends to return to the place of residence where 19 20 the individual is otherwise qualified to vote.

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
