A BILL

To reauthorize the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972,
and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Coastal Zone Reau-
5 thorization Act of 2008”.

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

7 Section 318 of the Coastal Zone Management Act of
8 1972 (16 U.S.C. 1464) is amended by striking “SEC. 318.”

1 And all that follows through subsection (a) and inserting
2 the following:

3 “SEC. 318. (a) There are authorized to be appro-
4 priated to the Secretary, to remain available until ex-
5 pended—

6 “(1) for grants under sections 306, 306a, and
7 309—

8 “(A) \$75,000,000 for fiscal year 2009;

9 “(B) \$82,500,000 for fiscal year 2010; and

10 “(C) \$90,750,000 for fiscal year 2011; and

11 “(2) for grants under section 315—

12 “(A) \$18,000,000 for fiscal year 2009;

13 “(B) \$19,800,000 for fiscal year 2010; and

14 “(C) \$21,780,000 for fiscal year 2011.”.

15 **SEC. 3. COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT FUND.**

16 Section 308(b)(2)(A) of the Coastal Zone Manage-
17 ment Act of 1972 (16 U.S.C. 1456a(b)(2)(A)) is amended
18 by striking “1997, 1998, and 1999” and inserting “2009,
19 2010, and 2011”.

20 **SEC. 4. COASTAL ZONE ENHANCEMENT GRANTS.**

21 Section 309(f) of the Coastal Zone Management Act
22 of 1972 (16 U.S.C. 1456b(f)) is amended—

23 (1) by striking “1991” and inserting “2009”;

24 and

1 (2) by striking “\$10,000,000” and inserting
2 “\$11,000,000”.
