- 5 7545(o)) is amended by adding the following new para-
- 6 graph at the end thereof:

"(13) 10 PERCENT RETAIL RENEWABLE FUEL 1 2 REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 1 year after the en-3 actment of this paragraph, the Administrator shall 4 promulgate regulations under this section requiring that, after December 31, 2012, all gasoline motor 5 6 vehicle fuel sold or dispensed to consumers in the contiguous United States, on an annual average 7 8 basis, contain not less than 10 percent renewable 9 fuel (as defined in paragraph (1) of this subsection).". 10
