Mr. HOLT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

A BILL

To establish the American Veterans Congressional Internship Program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. AMERICAN VETERANS CONGRESSIONAL IN-4 TERNSHIP PROGRAM.

5 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby established 6 the American Veterans Congressional Internship Pro-7 gram, under which each Member of the House of Rep-8 resentatives may hire, for a period not to exceed 12 9 months, one additional employee who meets the eligibility 10 criteria described in subsection (b) to serve as the Amer-11 ican Veteran Congressional Intern.

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—An individual is eligible to
3 serve as an American Veteran Congressional Intern
4 for the office of a Member of the House of Rep5 resentatives if the individual meets such criteria as
6 the Committee on House Administration may estab7 lish.

8 (2)SPECIFIC INFORMATION AND ASSUR-9 ANCES.—Under the criteria established under para-10 graph (1), an individual shall not be eligible to serve 11 as an Intern for the office of a Member of the House 12 of Representatives unless the individual provides the 13 following:

14 (A) A certification that the individual
15 served in the Armed Forces of the United
16 States or in the reserve components of the
17 armed forces.

(B) A certification that the individual washonorably discharged from such service.

(c) COMPENSATION.—A Member of the House of
Representatives shall pay the American Veteran Congressional Intern serving in the Member's office a total salary
of \$25,000, to be paid to the Intern at a rate of \$2,083.33
per month out of applicable accounts of the House of Representatives.

1SEC. 2. NO EFFECT ON NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES OR MEM-2BER'S REPRESENTATIONAL ALLOWANCE.

The employment of an American Veteran Congressional Intern by a Member of the House of Representatives, and the payment of a salary to such an Intern by a Member, shall be in addition to all personnel and allowances otherwise made available to Members under other provisions of law, rule, or other authority.

9 SEC. 3. REGULATIONS.

10 The Committee on House Administration shall pre-11 scribe such regulations as may be necessary to carry out12 this Act.

13 SEC. 4. DEFINITION.

In this Act, the term "Member of the House of Rep-resentatives" includes a Delegate or Resident Commis-sioner to Congress.
