1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. REPEAL OF THE 1954 JOHNSON AMENDMENT 4 BANNING THE FREE SPEECH AND FIRST 5 AMENDMENT RIGHTS OF CHURCHES AND EX-6 EMPT ORGANIZATIONS. 7 (a) In General.—Paragraph (3) of section 501(c) 8 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to list of exempt organizations) is amended by striking ", and which

does not participate in, or intervene in (including the pub-

- 1 lishing or distributing of statements), any political cam-
- 2 paign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for
- 3 public office".
- 4 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 5 this section shall apply to taxable years ending after the
- 6 date of the enactment of this Act.
- 7 (c) Campaign Finance Laws Unaffected.—The
- 8 amendments made by this section shall not invalidate or
- 9 limit any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act
- 10 of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 431 et seq.).
