## In the Senate of the United States,

September 27, 2007.

*Resolved*, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 327) entitled "An Act to amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to develop and implement a comprehensive program designed to reduce the incidence of suicide among veterans.", do pass with the following

## **AMENDMENT:**

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

- 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Joshua Omvig Veterans
- 3 Suicide Prevention Act".

## 4 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 5 It is the sense of Congress that—
- 6 (1) suicide among veterans suffering from post-
- 7 traumatic stress disorder (in this section referred to
- 8 as "PTSD") is a serious problem; and

1	(2) the Secretary of Veterans Affairs should take
2	into consideration the special needs of veterans suf-
3	fering from PTSD and the special needs of elderly
4	veterans who are at high risk for depression and expe-
5	rience high rates of suicide in developing and imple-
6	menting the comprehensive program under this Act.
7	SEC. 3. COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM FOR SUICIDE PREVEN-
8	TION AMONG VETERANS.
9	(a) IN GENERAL.—
10	(1) Comprehensive program for suicide
11	PREVENTION AMONG VETERANS.—Chapter 17 of title
12	38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
13	end the following new section:
14	"§1720F. Comprehensive program for suicide preven-
15	tion among veterans
16	"(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall develop
17	and carry out a comprehensive program designed to reduce
18	the incidence of suicide among veterans incorporating the
19	components described in this section.
20	"(b) Staff Education.—In carrying out the com-
21	prehensive program under this section, the Secretary shall
22	provide for mandatory training for appropriate staff and
23	contractors (including all medical personnel) of the Depart-
24	ment who interact with veterans. This training shall cover
25	information appropriate to the duties being performed by

such staff and contractors. The training shall include infor mation on—

"(1) recognizing risk factors for suicide; 3 4 "(2) proper protocols for responding to crisis sit-5 uations involving veterans who may be at high risk 6 for suicide; and "(3) best practices for suicide prevention. 7 8 "(c) Health Assessments of Veterans.—In car-9 rying out the comprehensive program, the Secretary shall direct that medical staff offer mental health in their overall 10 health assessment when veterans seek medical care at a De-11 partment medical facility (including a center established 12 under section 1712A of this title) and make referrals, at 13

14 the request of the veteran concerned, to appropriate coun-15 seling and treatment programs for veterans who show signs16 or symptoms of mental health problems.

17 "(d) Designation of Suicide Prevention Coun-SELORS.—In carrying out the comprehensive program, the 18 19 Secretary shall designate a suicide prevention counselor at each Department medical facility other than centers estab-20 21 lished under section 1712A of this title. Each counselor shall 22 work with local emergency rooms, police departments, men-23 tal health organizations, and veterans service organizations 24 to engage in outreach to veterans and improve the coordination of mental health care to veterans. 25

1	"(e) Best Practices Research.—In carrying out
2	the comprehensive program, the Secretary shall provide for
3	research on best practices for suicide prevention among vet-
4	erans. Research shall be conducted under this subsection in
5	consultation with the heads of the following entities:
6	"(1) The Department of Health and Human
7	Services.
8	"(2) The National Institute of Mental Health.
9	"(3) The Substance Abuse and Mental Health
10	Services Administration.
11	"(4) The Centers for Disease Control and Pre-
12	vention.
13	"(f) Sexual Trauma Research.—In carrying out
14	the comprehensive program, the Secretary shall provide for
15	research on mental health care for veterans who have experi-
16	enced sexual trauma while in military service. The research
17	design shall include consideration of veterans of a reserve
18	component.
19	"(g) 24-Hour Mental Health Care.—In carrying
20	out the comprehensive program, the Secretary shall provide
21	for mental health care availability to veterans on a 24-hour
22	basis.
23	"(h) HOTHINE In carrying out the commentation

23 "(h) HOTLINE.—In carrying out the comprehensive24 program, the Secretary may provide for a toll-free hotline

for veterans to be staffed by appropriately trained mental
 health personnel and available at all times.

3 "(i) OUTREACH AND EDUCATION FOR VETERANS AND
4 FAMILIES.—In carrying out the comprehensive program,
5 the Secretary shall provide for outreach to and education
6 for veterans and the families of veterans, with special em7 phasis on providing information to veterans of Operation
8 Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom and the
9 families of such veterans. Education to promote mental
10 health shall include information designed to—

11 "(1) remove the stigma associated with mental 12 illness: 13 "(2) encourage veterans to seek treatment and 14 assistance for mental illness; "(3) promote skills for coping with mental ill-15 16 ness: and 17 "(4) help families of veterans with— 18 "(A) understanding issues arising from the 19 readjustment of veterans to civilian life: "(B) identifying signs and symptoms of 20 21 mental illness; and 22 "(C) encouraging veterans to seek assistance 23 for mental illness. 24 "(j) PEER SUPPORT COUNSELING PROGRAM.—(1) In carrying out the comprehensive program, the Secretary may 25

establish and carry out a peer support counseling program, 1 2 under which veterans shall be permitted to volunteer as peer 3 counselors— 4 "(A) to assist other veterans with issues re-5 lated to mental health and readjustment; and 6 "(B) to conduct outreach to veterans and 7 the families of veterans. 8 "(2) In carrying out the peer support counseling pro-9 gram under this subsection, the Secretary shall provide adequate training for peer counselors. 10 11 "(k) OTHER COMPONENTS.—In carrying out the comprehensive program, the Secretary may provide for other 12 actions to reduce the incidence of suicide among veterans 13 14 that the Secretary considers appropriate.". 15 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-16 tions at the beginning of such chapter is amended by 17 adding at the end the following new item: "1720F. Comprehensive program for suicide prevention among veterans.". 18 (b) Report to Congress.— 19 (1) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 90 days 20 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-21 retary of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress a 22 report on the comprehensive program under section 1720F of title 38, United States Code, as added by 23 24 subsection (a).

1	(2) Contents of report.—The report shall
2	contain the following:
3	(A) Information on the status of the imple-
4	mentation of such program.
5	(B) Information on the time line and costs
6	for complete implementation of the program
7	within two years.
8	(C) A plan for additional programs and ac-
9	tivities designed to reduce the occurrence of sui-
10	cide among veterans.
11	(D) Recommendations for further legislation
12	or administrative action that the Secretary con-
13	siders appropriate to improve suicide prevention
14	programs within the Department of Veterans Af-
15	fairs.
