# A BILL

To encourage the donation of excess food to nonprofit organizations that provide assistance to food-insecure people in the United States in contracts entered into by executive agencies for the provision, service, or sale of food.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Food Donation
- 5 Act of 2007".

#### 1 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.

- 2 The purpose of this Act is to encourage executive
- 3 agencies and their contractors, whenever practical and
- 4 safe, to donate excess, apparently wholesome food to feed
- 5 food-insecure people in the United States.

### 6 SEC. 3. PROMOTING FEDERAL FOOD DONATION.

- 7 (a) Revision of FAR To Include Clause Relat-
- 8 ING TO FOOD DONATIONS.—Not later than 180 days after
- 9 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Federal Acquisi-
- 10 tion Regulation shall be revised to provide that all con-
- 11 tracts above the simplified acquisition threshold for the
- 12 provision, service, or sale of food, or for the lease or rental
- 13 of Federal property to a private entity for events at which
- 14 food is provided, shall include a clause that—
- 15 (1) encourages the donation of excess, appar-
- ently wholesome food to nonprofit organizations that
- provide assistance to food-insecure people in the
- 18 United States:
- 19 (2) provides that the head of an executive agen-
- 20 cy shall not assume responsibility for the costs and
- 21 logistics of collecting, transporting, maintaining the
- safety of, or distributing such excess, apparently
- 23 wholesome food to food-insecure people in the
- 24 United States; and
- 25 (3) states that executive agencies and contrac-
- tors making donations pursuant to this Act are pro-

- 1 tected from civil or criminal liability under the Bill
- 2 Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act (42
- 3 U.S.C. 1791).
- 4 (b) Applicability.—The revisions to the Federal
- 5 Acquisition Regulation made pursuant to subsection (a)
- 6 shall not apply to contracts entered into by the Depart-
- 7 ment of Defense.
- 8 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.
- 9 In this Act:
- 10 (1) Excess.—The term "excess", when applied
- to food, means food that is not required to meet the
- needs of executive agencies and would otherwise be
- discarded.
- 14 (2) Apparently wholesome food.—The
- term "apparently wholesome food" has the meaning
- provided in section 2(b)(2) of the Bill Emerson Good
- 17 Samaritan Food Donation Act (42 U.S.C.
- 18 1791(b)(2).
- 19 (3) Nonprofit organization.—The term
- 20 "nonprofit organization" means any organization
- 21 that is described in section 501(c) of the Internal
- Revenue Code of 1986 and is exempt from tax under
- section 501(a) of such Code.

1 (4) FOOD INSECURE.—The term "food inse-2 cure" means inconsistent access to sufficient, safe, 3 and nutritious food.

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
