- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Habeas Corpus Res-
- 3 toration Act of 2007".
- 4 SEC. 2. RESTORATION OF HABEAS CORPUS FOR THOSE DE-
- 5 TAINED BY THE UNITED STATES.
- 6 (a) In General.—Section 2241 of title 28, United
- 7 States Code, is amended by striking subsection (e).
- 8 (b) Title 10.—Section 950j of title 10, United
- 9 States Code, is amended by striking subsection (b) and
- 10 inserting the following:
- 11 "(b) Limited Review of Military Commission
- 12 Procedures and Actions.—Except as otherwise pro-
- 13 vided in this chapter or in section 2241 of title 28 or any
- 14 other habeas corpus provision, and notwithstanding any
- 15 other provision of law, no court, justice, or judge shall
- 16 have jurisdiction to hear or consider any claim or cause
- 17 of action whatsoever, including any action pending on or
- 18 filed after the date of the enactment of the Military Com-
- 19 missions Act of 2006, relating to the prosecution, trial,
- 20 or judgment of a military commission under this chapter,
- 21 including challenges to the lawfulness of procedures of
- 22 military commissions under this chapter.".
- 23 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICABILITY.
- The amendments made by this Act shall—
- 25 (1) take effect on the date of the enactment of

- 1 (2) apply to any case that is pending on or
- 2 after the date of enactment of this Act.
