To provide permanent treatment authority for participants in Department of Defense chemical and biological testing conducted by Deseret Test Center and an expanded study of the health impact of Project Shipboard Hazard and Defense, and for other purposes.

1 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT TREATMENT AUTHORITY FOR**
2 **PARTICIPANTS IN DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE**
3 **CHEMICAL AND BIOLOGICAL TESTING CON-**
4 **DUCTED BY DESERET TEST CENTER (INCLUD-**
5 **ING PROJECT SHIPBOARD HAZARD AND DE-**
6 **FENSE).**

7 Section 1710(e)(3) of title 38, United States Code,
8 is amended—

9 (1) in subparagraph (B), by inserting “and”
10 after the semicolon;

11 (2) in subparagraph (C), by striking “; and”
12 and inserting a period; and

13 (3) by striking subparagraph (D).

14 **SEC. 2. EXPANDED STUDY ON THE HEALTH IMPACT OF**
15 **PROJECT SHIPBOARD HAZARD AND DE-**
16 **FENSE.**

17 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 90 days after the
18 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Vet-
19 erans Affairs shall enter into a contract with the Institute
20 of Medicine of the National Academies to conduct an ex-
21 panded study on the health impact of Project Shipboard
22 Hazard and Defense (Project SHAD).

23 (b) **COVERED VETERANS.**—The study required by
24 subsection (a) shall include, to the extent practicable, all
25 veterans who participated in Project Shipboard Hazard
26 and Defense.

1 (c) UTILIZATION OF EXISTING STUDIES.—The study
2 required by subsection (a) may use results from the study
3 covered in the report entitled “Long-Term Health Effects
4 of Participation in Project SHAD” of the Institute of
5 Medicine of the National Academies.

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
