## A BILL

To establish a pilot program to demonstrate best practices, innovation, and knowledge transfer regarding cyber security within State governments.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “State Cyber Security  
5       Protection Act of 2008”.

6       **SEC. 2. STATE CYBER SECURITY PILOT PROGRAM.**

7       Subtitle C of title II of the Homeland Security Act  
8       of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 141 et seq.) is amended by adding at  
9       the end the following:

1 **“SEC. 226. STATE CYBER SECURITY PILOT PROGRAM.**

2 “(a) IN GENERAL.—There is established within the  
3 Department a State Cyber Security Pilot Program (in this  
4 section referred to as the ‘Pilot Program’) to demonstrate  
5 best practices, innovation, and knowledge transfer regard-  
6 ing cyber security within State governments.

7 “(b) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary, through the  
8 Assistant Secretary for Cyber Security and Communica-  
9 tions, shall be responsible for administering the Pilot Pro-  
10 gram.

11 “(c) DIVERSITY IN PARTICIPATION.—The Secretary  
12 shall ensure the maintenance of geographic and population  
13 diversity among selected Pilot Program participants.

14 “(d) ALLOCATION LIMITATIONS.—Amounts allocated  
15 to a State under this section shall not exceed \$3,000,000.

16 “(e) SUNSET.—The authorization for the Pilot Pro-  
17 gram established under this section shall expire 2 years  
18 following the date of enactment of this section.

19 “(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There  
20 are authorized to be appropriated up to \$25,000,000 in  
21 each of fiscal years 2009 and 2010 to carry out the Pilot  
22 Program established under this section.”.
