A BILL

To make the United States more secure by implementing unfinished recommendations of the 9/11 Commission to fight the war on terror more effectively, to improve homeland security, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Improving America’s
5 Security by Implementing Unfinished Recommendations
6 of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007”.

1 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

2 It is the sense of Congress that Congress should
3 enact, and the President should sign, legislation to make
4 the United States more secure by implementing unfinished
5 recommendations of the 9/11 Commission to fight the war
6 on terror more effectively and to improve homeland secu-
7 rity.
