3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Enumerated Powers5 Act".

1SEC. 2. SPECIFICATION OF CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY2FOR ENACTMENT OF LAW.

3 (a) CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY FOR THIS ACT.—
4 This Act is enacted pursuant to the power granted Con5 gress under article I, section 8, clause 18, of the United
6 States Constitution and the power granted to each House
7 of Congress under article I, section 5, clause 2, of the
8 United States Constitution.

9 (b) CONSTITUTIONAL AUTHORITY STATEMENT RE-10 QUIRED.—Chapter 2 of title 1, United States Code, is 11 amended by inserting after section 102 the following new 12 section:

13 "§ 102a. Constitutional authority clause

14 "Each Act of Congress shall contain a concise and 15 definite statement of the constitutional authority relied 16 upon for the enactment of each portion of that Act. The 17 failure to comply with this section shall give rise to a point 18 of order in either House of Congress. The availability of 19 this point of order does not affect any other available re-20 lief."

(c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of chapter 2 of title 1, United States
Code, is amended by inserting after the item relating to
section 102 the following new item:

"102a. Constitutional authority clause.".
