## A BILL

To provide for the training of Federal building personnel, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Buildings Per-
- 5 sonnel Training Act of 2010".
- 6 SEC. 2. TRAINING OF FEDERAL BUILDING PERSONNEL.
- 7 (a) Identification of Core Competencies.—Not
- 8 later than 18 months after the date of enactment of this
- 9 Act, and annually thereafter, the Administrator of General
- 10 Services, in consultation with representatives of relevant

- 1 professional societies, industry associations, and appren-
- 2 ticeship training providers, and after providing notice and
- 3 an opportunity for comment, shall identify the core com-
- 4 petencies necessary for Federal personnel performing
- 5 building operations and maintenance, energy manage-
- 6 ment, safety, and design functions to comply with require-
- 7 ments under Federal law. The core competencies identified
- 8 shall include competencies relating to building operations
- 9 and maintenance, energy management, sustainability,
- 10 water efficiency, safety (including electrical safety), and
- 11 building performance measures.
- 12 (b) Designation of Relevant Courses, Certifi-
- 13 cations, Degrees, Licenses, and Registrations.—
- 14 The Administrator, in consultation with representatives of
- 15 relevant professional societies, industry associations, and
- 16 apprenticeship training providers, shall identify a course,
- 17 certification, degree, license, or registration to dem-
- 18 onstrate each core competency, and for ongoing training
- 19 with respect to each core competency, identified for a cat-
- 20 egory of personnel specified in subsection (a).
- 21 (c) Identified Competencies.—An individual
- 22 shall demonstrate each core competency identified by the
- 23 Administrator under subsection (a) for the category of
- 24 personnel that includes such individual. An individual
- 25 shall demonstrate each core competency through the

- 1 means identified under subsection (b) not later than one
- 2 year after the date on which such core competency is iden-
- 3 tified under subsection (a) or, if the date of hire of such
- 4 individual occurs after the date of such identification, not
- 5 later than one year after such date of hire. In the case
- 6 of an individual hired for an employment period not to
- 7 exceed one year, such individual shall demonstrate each
- 8 core competency at the start of the employment period.
- 9 (d) Continuing Education.—The Administrator,
- 10 in consultation with representatives of relevant profes-
- 11 sional societies, industry associations, and apprenticeship
- 12 training providers, shall develop or identify comprehensive
- 13 continuing education courses to ensure the operation of
- 14 Federal buildings in accordance with industry best prac-
- 15 tices and standards.
- 16 (e) Curriculum With Respect to Facility Man-
- 17 AGEMENT AND OPERATION OF HIGH-PERFORMANCE
- 18 BUILDINGS.—Not later than 18 months after the date of
- 19 enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Ad-
- 20 ministrator, acting through the head of the Office of Fed-
- 21 eral High-Performance Green Buildings, and the Sec-
- 22 retary of Energy, acting through the head of the Office
- 23 of Commercial High-Performance Green Buildings, in
- 24 consultation with the heads of other appropriate Federal
- 25 departments and agencies and representatives of relevant

- 1 professional societies, industry associations, and appren-
- 2 ticeship training providers, shall develop a recommended
- 3 curriculum relating to facility management and the oper-
- 4 ation of high-performance buildings.
- 5 (f) Applicability of This Section to Functions
- 6 Performed Under Contract.—Training requirements
- 7 under this section shall apply to non-Federal personnel
- 8 performing building operations and maintenance, energy
- 9 management, safety, and design functions under a con-
- 10 tract with a Federal department or agency. A contractor
- 11 shall provide training to, and certify the demonstration of
- 12 core competencies for, non-Federal personnel in a manner
- 13 that is approved by the Administrator.

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
