## A BILL

To give subpoen power to the National Commission on the BP Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill and Offshore Drilling.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SUBPOENA POWER OF THE NATIONAL COMMIS-
- 4 SION ON THE BP DEEPWATER HORIZON OIL
- 5 SPILL AND OFFSHORE DRILLING.
- 6 (a) Subpoena Power.—The National Commission
- 7 on the BP Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill and Offshore

Drilling established by Executive Order No. 13543 of May 21, 2010 (in this section referred to as the "Commis-3 sion"), may issue subpoenas to compel the attendance and 4 testimony of witnesses and the production of books, 5 records, correspondence, memoranda, and other docu-6 ments. 7 (b) Issuance.— 8 AUTHORIZATION.—A subpoena may be 9 issued under this section only— 10 (A) by agreement of the Co-Chairs of the 11 Commission; or 12 (B) by the affirmative vote of a majority of 13 the members of the Commission. 14 (2) SIGNATURE AND SERVICE.—A subpoena 15 issued under this section may be issued under the 16 signature of either Co-Chair or any member des-17 ignated by a majority of the Commission, and may 18 be served by any person designated by the Co-Chairs 19 or a member designated by a majority of the Com-20 mission. 21 (c) Enforcement.— 22 (1) REQUIRED PROCEDURES.—In the case of 23 contumacy of any person issued a subpoena under 24 this section or refusal by such person to comply with

the subpoena, the Commission shall request the At-

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1 torney General to seek enforcement of the subpoena.

2 Upon such request, the Attorney General shall seek

3 enforcement of the subpoena in a court described in

4 paragraph (2). The court in which the Attorney

5 General seeks enforcement of the subpoena shall

6 issue an order requiring the subpoenaed person to

7 appear at any designated place to testify or to

8 produce documentary or other evidence, and may

punish any failure to obey the order as a contempt

of that court.

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(2) Jurisdiction for enforcement.—Any United States district court for a judicial district in which a person issued a subpoena under this section resides, is served, or may be found, or where the subpoena is returnable, shall have jurisdiction to enforce the subpoena as provided in paragraph (1).

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
