A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into an agreement with Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Louisiana, to construct a curatorial center for the use of Cane River Creole National Historical Park, the National Center for Preservation Technology and Training, and the University, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "National Park Service
- 3 and Northwestern State University Collections Conserva-
- 4 tion Center Act".

5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 6 Congress finds that—
- 7 (1) Cane River Creole National Historical Park 8 has a nationally significant museum collection of 9 more than 1,000,000 objects that is housed in leased 10 space that fails to meet National Park Service mu-11 seum standards;
 - (2) there is no land within the boundary of the historical park in Natchitoches Parish that is above the 500-year floodplain, which is the level required for constructing curatorial facilities under National Park Service policies;
 - (3) the historical park has a longstanding partnership with Northwestern State University, with which the historical park is required under the enabling legislation for the historical park to coordinate a Cane River region comprehensive research program, including a program for curation methods;
 - (4) in 1992, the National Center for Preservation Technology and Training, which is administered by the National Park Service, was established at Northwestern University under section 403 of the

- National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470x-2);
- (5) the National Center for Preservation Technology and Training requires additional space to house equipment and workspace connected with the development and dissemination of preservation and conservation skills and technologies; and
- 8 (6) contingent on the approval by the Board of 9 Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System, 10 Northwestern State University is willing to make 11 available land suitable for the National Park Service 12 to construct a facility for curatorial and workspace 13 needs of the National Center for Preservation Tech-14 nology and Training if the University is able to use 15 space in the facility for educational purposes relating 16 to the Williamson Museum collection of the Univer-17 sitv.

18 SEC. 3. COLLECTIONS CONSERVATION CENTER.

- 19 Section 304 of the Cane River Creole National His-
- 20 torical Park and National Heritage Area Act (16 U.S.C.
- 21 410ccc-2) is amended by adding at the end the following:
- 22 "(f) Collections Conservation Center.—
- 23 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may enter
- into an agreement with Northwestern State Univer-
- 25 sity (referred to in this subsection as the 'Univer-

1	sity') to construct a facility on land owned by the
2	University to be used—
3	"(A) to house the museum collection of the
4	historical park;
5	"(B) to provide additional space for use by
6	the National Center for Preservation Tech-
7	nology and Training; and
8	"(C) to provide space to the University for
9	educational purposes relating to the Williamson
10	Museum collection, if the University pays an
11	appropriate rental fee to the National Park
12	Service, as determined in the agreement entered
13	into under this paragraph.
14	"(2) Use of fee.—Proceeds from the rental
15	fees collected under paragraph (1)(C) shall be avail-
16	able, without further appropriation, for the historical
17	park.".
18	SEC. 4. TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS.
19	The Cane River Creole National Historical Park and
20	National Heritage Area Act (16 U.S.C. 410ccc et seq.)
21	is amended—
22	(1) in the third sentence of section 304(e) (16
23	U.S.C. 410ccc-2(e)), by striking "of Technology"
24	and inserting "Technology": and

- 1 (2) in section 305(a) (16 U.S.C. 41ccc-3(a)),
- 2 by striking "interest" and inserting "interests".
