To amend title 46, United States Code, to ensure that the prohibition on disclosure of maritime transportation security information is not used inappropriately to shield certain other information from public disclosure, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. MARITIME TRANSPORTATION SECURITY IN-
- 4 FORMATION.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 70103(d) of title 46,
- 6 United States Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 "(d) Nondisclosure of Information.—

1	"(1) In General.—Information developed
2	under this chapter is not required to be disclosed to
3	the public, including—
4	"(A) facility security plans, vessel security
5	plans, and port vulnerability assessments; and
6	"(B) other information related to security
7	plans, procedures, or programs for vessels or fa-
8	cilities authorized under this chapter.
9	"(2) Limitations.—Nothing in paragraph (1)
10	shall be construed to authorize the classification of
11	information as sensitive security information (as de-
12	fined in section 1520.5 of title 49, Code of Federal
13	Regulations)—
14	"(A) to conceal a violation of law, ineffi-
15	ciency, or administrative error;
16	"(B) to prevent embarrassment to a per-
17	son, organization, or agency;
18	"(C) to restrain competition; or
19	"(D) to prevent or delay the release of in-
20	formation that does not require protection in
21	the interest of transportation security, including
22	basic scientific research information not clearly
23	related to transportation security.".

14	"(D) to prevent or delay the release of in-
15	formation that does not require protection in
16	the interest of transportation security, including
17	basic scientific research information not clearly
18	related to transportation security.".
19	(2) Section 40119(b) of title 49, United States
20	Code, is amended by adding at the end thereof the
21	following:
22	"(3) Nothing in paragraph (1) shall be construed to
23	authorize the classification of information as sensitive se-
24	curity information (as defined in section 1520.5 of title
25	49, Code of Federal Regulations)—

1	"(A) to conceal a violation of law, ineffi-
2	ciency, or administrative error;
3	"(B) to prevent embarrassment to a per-
4	son, organization, or agency;
5	"(C) to restrain competition; or
6	"(D) to prevent or delay the release of in-
7	formation that does not require protection in
8	the interest of transportation security, including
9	basic scientific research information not clearly
10	related to transportation security.".
