Mr. FEINGOLD introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to increase the maximum age for children eligible for medical care under the CHAMPVA program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. INCREASE OF MAXIMUM AGE FOR CHILDREN**
4 **ELIGIBLE FOR MEDICAL CARE UNDER**
5 **CHAMPVA PROGRAM.**

6 (a) INCREASE.—Section 1781(c) of title 38, United
7 States Code, is amended—

8 (1) by striking “twenty-three” and inserting
9 “twenty-six”; and

1 (2) by striking “twenty-third birthday” and in-
2 serting “twenty-sixth birthday”.

3 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
4 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to medical care pro-
5 vided on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 **SEC. 2. CANCELLATION OF HUMAN LUNAR MISSION UNDER**
7 **CONSTELLATION PROGRAM OF NATIONAL**
8 **AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION.**

9 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Except as provided in subsection
10 (b), the Administrator of the National Aeronautics and
11 Space Administration may not obligate or expend any
12 amount to support a human lunar mission, including any
13 such mission under the Constellation Program of the Ad-
14 ministration.

15 (b) **EXCEPTION.**—The Administrator may use
16 amounts obligated or otherwise made available before the
17 date of the enactment of this Act for a human lunar mis-
18 sion, including amounts for a human lunar mission under
19 the Constellation Program, to wind down any activity or
20 operations related to such mission.

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
