A BILL

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "César Estrada Chávez5 Study Act".

6 SEC. 2. RESOURCE STUDY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 years after the
8 date on which funds are made available to carry out this
9 Act, the Secretary of the Interior (referred to in this Act

1	as the "Secretary") shall complete a resource study of
2	sites in the State of Arizona, the State of California, and
3	other States that are significant to the life of César E.
4	Chávez and the farm labor movement in the western
5	United States to determine—
6	(1) appropriate methods for preserving and in-

8	(2) whether any of the sites meets the criteria
9	for listing on the National Register of Historic
10	Places or designation as a national historic land-
11	mark under—
12	(A) the Act of August 21, 1935 (16 U.S.C.

14	(B) the National Historic Preservation Act
15	(16 U.S.C. 470 et seq.).
16	(b) REQUIREMENTS.—In conducting the study under

9 a report that describes—

10 (1) the findings of the study; and

11 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

12 SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

13 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums14 as are necessary to carry out this Act.

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
